6th Annual Juniata River Cleanup

This year we put in at the new Riverside Park Boat Launch (Mt. Union, PA) and covered a 5.2 mile stretch of the Juniata River down to the Shawmut



Boat Launch (Mt. Union, PA). The 35 hardworking volunteers removed 160 tires and 4.76 tons of trash from the river! With the conclusion of this year's event, we have now cleaned approximately 25 miles of the Juniata River starting from the Frankstown Branch and Little Juniata River confluence, all the way down to the Huntingdon/Mifflin county line!

A special thanks goes out to Rothrock Outfitters for their coordination of the event, focus on river safety, and for providing canoes and shuttles for the volunteers!

Donations were also received from Parks Garbage, Mount Union Original Italian Pizza, Strickler's, Huntingdon County Dairy Promotion, Giant Foods, and the Weis Store in Huntingdon. The cleanup was funded by a grant from the Community Foundation for the Alleghenies through the Foundation for Pennsylvania Watersheds.



13th Annual Tire War

The Gold Rim Award remains in Huntingdon! Keep Huntingdon County Beautiful won the 13th annual Tire Recycling Challenge by collecting **1,722 tires** on Saturday, September 15th at the Huntingdon County Fairgrounds. Adding in the tires collected by the other counties - Mifflin County 328 tires; Perry

County 439 tires; and Juniata
County 824 tires – the event totaled
3,313 tires!
Instead of polluting our land and streams, all of those tires will be recycled into useable products,



such as rubber mulch for playgrounds or athletic tracks. Thank you to the Huntingdon County Career and Technology Center for providing volunteers!
